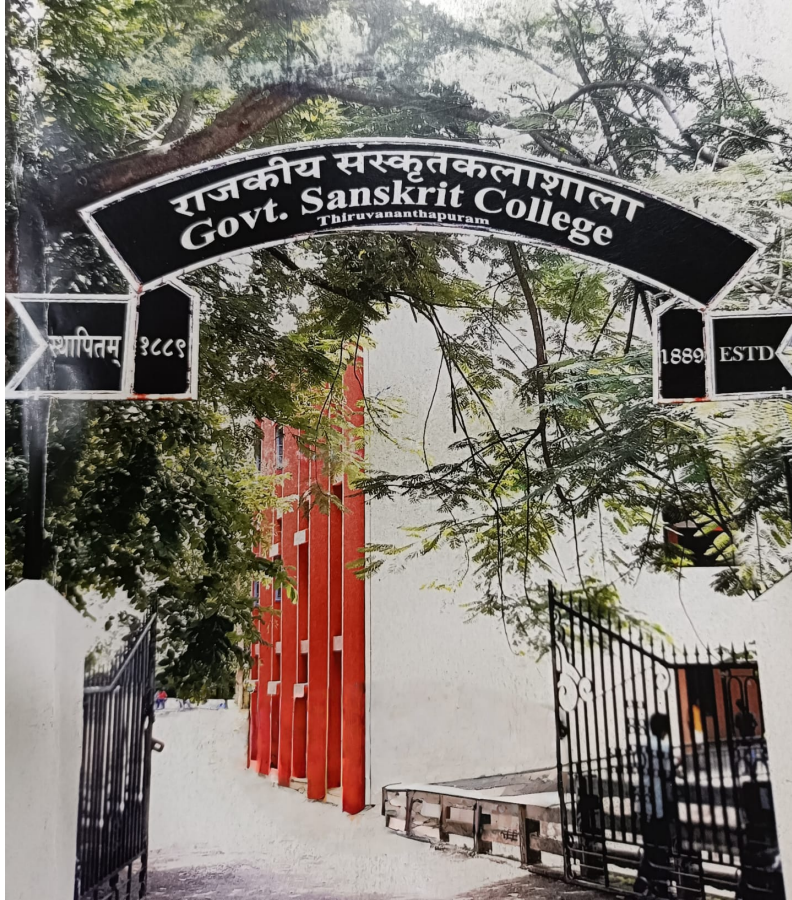

Founded in 1889 by one of Travancore's most renowned kings, Sri Mulam Thirunal Rama Varma, the college was inspired by his visit to the Sanskrit College in Banaras, where he delivered lectures on various sastra-s. He invited eminent Sanskrit scholars from across India to establish a new teaching program, leading to the creation of the Sanskrit College at Mitrandapuram, near the Fort. For 35 years, the institution thrived under royal patronage, initially supported by Rajashri and later by Sri Chithira Thirunal Balarama Varma, who took a keen interest in promoting Sanskrit studies and facilitated the construction of a new facility. In 1947, the college transitioned to a full-fledged First Grade Degree College, becoming the first of its kind in South India after nearly a century of excellence.
